Day 1 -Monday - February 23, 2026 - Welcome Aboard!

Our New Zealand/Australia tour begins with a transfer to Chicago O'Hare this afternoon for our overnight flight to New Zealand. Due to crossing the International Date Line to New Zealand we will lose **a day in our travels of February 24, 2026**, which may sound confusing however we do gain it back upon our return to the United States!

Day 2 – Wednesday -February 25, 2026 - Welcome to New Zealand – Auckland City Tour

Upon Arrival in New Zealand, we will embark on a half day tour of the country's largest city, Auckland.

Known as **"The City of Sails"**, Auckland is situated on 53 dormant volcanic cones and between two Harbors, the sparkling Waitemata and the brooding Manukau. We'll travel through Auckland's central business district, past the Auckland University and inner-city park, known as the Domain. Then continue through the picturesque suburbs to our overnight stay in the Sky City Auckland. Dinner this evening will be at the top of our Sky City Auckland hotel. **(Dinner)**

Overnight Stay: Sky City Auckland

Day 3 –Thursday - February 26, 2026 - Auckland – Wine Tasting – Hamilton Maze Farming – Cambridge Farm-stay

This morning, we'll visit the **Vilagrad Winery** for a wine tour and tasting. Established in 1922, the Vilagrad Winery is now in its fifth generation as a family owned and operated winery, specializing in fine wines, food and entertainment. Our exquisite range of multi-award-winning wines are carefully hand harvested and hand crafted at the winery creating high quality wines that reflect the climate and soils of the region. (We suggest selecting a bottle of wine for our farm stay hosts!) After a local lunch in Hamilton, we will visit a **Waikato Maize growing farm**. Maize farming, particularly for silage, is a common practice, with dairy farmers often considering it to reduce feed costs and boost profits. We then travel to Cambridge where you will join your **Farm-stay** host. **(Breakfast, Lunch, Wine Tasting, Dinner)**

Overnight Stay: Cambridge Farm-Stay

Day 4 – Friday February 27, 2026 - Cambridge Dairy Farm – Waitomo Glowworm Caves – Rotorua Mital – Hangi Dinner

We bid farewell to our farm hosts families and visit a modern **New Zealand working dairy farm** this morning. Next, we enjoy a BBQ Lunch at the Roselands Restaurant. This afternoon we will travel to **Waitomo Glowworm Caves** where a knowledgeable guide will lead us through the limestone chambers and passages to see stunning features like the Tomo (a deep shaft that falls away to the darkness below), and the famous **'Cathedral'**. The highlight of our visit to the Glowworm Cave is a silent boat trip through the glow-worm grotto. Marvel at Mother Nature's light display as you glide quietly beneath the lights of thousands of glowworms suspended from the cave ceiling.

Next, we visit the cultural center of the North Island – **Rotorua**. Enter the world of **Mitai** and learn about the history of this area which once flourished in villages through the dynamic scenes of warriors paddling the war canoe down Wai-o-Whiro stream. The melodious sounds of instruments and entertainment are highlighted through the haka and performing arts. Enjoy a traditional buffet **Hangi Dinner** followed by an evening walk through the forest visiting the old village site and discovering the sacred natural spring Te Puna Tapu a Tuhoe. **(Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner)**

Overnight Stay: Rotorua – Sudima Hotel

Day 5 – Saturday - February 28, 2026 - Rotorua Sightseeing – Craft Institute – Thermal Geysers – Agro-dome

This morning, we explore Rotorua's rich history as we tour local landmarks including **New Zealand Maori Arts and Crafts Institute, Rotowhio Pa, Kiwi Conservation Centre** and the **Te Whakarewarewa Geothermal Valley** including **Pohutu Geyser**. Next, we visit the **Agrodome** featuring a Sheep Show exhibiting nineteen sheep breeds, sheepdog demonstrations and an exciting sheep auction. Following the show, experience an authentic working Farm Tour. Climb aboard the all-weather, all-terrain vehicle as we have an opportunity to see many of New Zealand's farm animals including Romney sheep, different cattle breeds, deer, llamas, ostrich, pigs and alpaca! You'll also explore the fruit orchard and olive grove and have the chance to taste natural kiwifruit juice and delicious, sweet honey. The balance of our day is free to explore the area. **(Breakfast)**

Overnight Stay: Rotorua – Sudima Hotel

Day 6 – Sunday - March 1, 2026 - Welcome to New Zealand's South Island - City Highlights – Canterbury Plains

After breakfast we transfer to the Rotorua airport for our flight to the **South Island of New Zealand**. Upon arrival in **Christchurch**, we enjoy a tour that covers the **central city highlights** including Mona Vale Gardens, Hagley Park, Riccarton House, Riccarton Bush, and the University of Canterbury. We then continue to the Sign of the Takahe, an historic building providing spectacular views over the city, **Canterbury Plains** and to the Southern Alps. Dinner will be at our hotel tonight. **(Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner)**

Overnight Stay: Christchurch: Rydges Latimer Christchurch

Day 7 –Monday - March 2, 2026 - TranzAlpine Railroad - Alps – Canterbury Plains - Franz Josef

After breakfast we transfer to the train station to board the train to Greymouth. The **TranzAlpine** is one of the world's great scenic train trips from one coast of New Zealand to another through the dramatic contrast of dry beech forests and tussock land on one side of the Alps and lush green landscapes on the other. From Christchurch, cross the patchwork farmland of the Canterbury plains, follow the Waimakariri River, climbing into alpine scenery on a series of spectacular viaducts. Then, after stopping at **Arthur's Pass**, emerge from the long **Otira Tunnel** and descend through a subtropical rain forest past beautiful Lake Brunner and on to Greymouth. We will then continue by coach to Franz Josef and will arrive just in time for a short walk to the **Glacier Viewpoint**. **(Breakfast)**

Overnight Stay: Franz Josef – Scenic Hotel Franz Josef

Day 8 – Tuesday - March 3, 2026 - West Coast Wildlife Centre – Haast Pass - Queenstown

This morning, we visit the **West Coast Wildlife Centre**, a unique and interactive experience that brings together nature, conservation and wildlife all under one roof! Leaving Franz Josef, we cross the border of the West Coast and Otago regions by travelling through the **Haast Pass** and its native beech forest. We will see Mount Aspiring National Park as we travel along the famous route that Maori used to search for pounamu (greenstone). As we drive along the shores of Lake Hawea, Lake Wanaka and Lake Dunstan, soak up the views before arriving in Queenstown. Tonight enjoy a late dinner at the **Queenstown Gondola**. **(Breakfast & Dinner)**

Overnight Stay: Queenstown – Millennium Hotel Queenstown

Day 9 – Wednesday - March 4, 2026 - Milford Sound Day Tour

Today we enjoy a relaxing trip along the shores of Lake Wakatipu to Te Anau for a short break, before continuing along the spectacular Milford Road. Upon reaching Milford Sound, we board a luxury vessel for a cruise the full-length of Milford Sound. The vessel provides excellent viewing opportunities and plenty of time is available to enjoy waterfalls, rainforest, mountains and wildlife. We return to Milford Wharf and reboard our coach for the return journey to Queenstown by road. **(Breakfast & Lunch)**

Overnight Stay: Queenstown – Millennium Hotel Queenstown

Day 10 –Thursday - March 5, 2026 Welcome to Australia – Sydney – Harbor Lunch Cruise

This morning, we transfer to the Queenstown Airport for our flight to Australia. Upon arrival in Sydney, we have a short tour of the city and see many contrasts - from the traditional Victorian architecture of the Town Hall to the modern skyscrapers of the business district. Observe the sweeping design of the Opera House and modern developments of Darling Harbor. Drive through the Botanic Garden to Lady Macquarie's Chair (for views of the harbor, Opera House and bridge). We then head out to the exclusive eastern suburbs, passing Kings Cross en route to Vaucluse and Double Bay. Continue to the Heads, the famous Bondi Beach and historic Paddington with its iron railed town house. We arrive at King Street Wharf for our Sydney Harbor lunch cruise. The balance of the afternoon and evening are free to explore this magnificent city! **(Breakfast and Lunch)**

Overnight Stay: Sydney – Novotel Sydney Central

Day 11 – Friday - March 6, 2026 - Koala Farm - Blue Mountains Tour – Scenic World

Today we visit the **Koala Farm** to learn all about Koalas and have the opportunity to take a photo with one and give it a pat. After the Koala we will head down to our Kangaroo walk-in area where we meet our Kangaroo's and Wallabies to experience more great photo opportunities. From this location we will also be able to watch the Kangaroo's, Wallabies and Emu's in their native free-range enclosure. Take advantage of our time remaining to visit the Wombats, Australian Native birds and Farmyard Nursery. Next, we head to the **Blue Mountains Visit Scenic World Scenic Rail, Skyway & Cableway**. Visit the **Katoomba Waterfalls** and the **New Sydney Zoo**. Scenic World is located in the World Heritage-listed Blue Mountains. In any season, Scenic World Blue Mountains is a must see for overseas and interstate visitors. **(Breakfast and Lunch)**

Overnight Stay: Sydney – Novotel Sydney Central

Day 12 – Saturday - March 7, 2026 - Cairns – World heritage Skyrail Adventure - Kuranda

This morning, we transfer to Sydney Airport for our flight to Cairns. Upon arrival in Cairns, we will embark on a journey aboard **Australia's World Heritage Skyrail** to Kuranda. Gliding just meters above the rainforest canopy in comfortable six-person gondola cabins, the Skyrail journey immerses you in an intimate rainforest experience where you'll see, hear, smell and become part of the tropical rainforest environment. Relax and enjoy the stunning rainforest scenery, panoramic views of the Cairns' tropical Falls, where you'll explore this amazing environment from the forest floor on boardwalks, scenic look-outs and in the state-of-the-art Rainforest Interpretation Centre. Skyrail is recognized as a world leader in eco-tourism and provides a truly unique rainforest experience. We'll enjoy lunch in Kuranda before heading back to Cairns for our overnight stays (Balance of afternoon and evening free). **(Breakfast & Lunch)**

Overnight Stay: Cairns – Pacific Cairns Hotel

Day 13 – Sunday - March 8, 2026 - Great Barrier Reef Tour

Quicksilver will take us to Agincourt Reef, at the very outer edge of the Barrier Reef. Here, special reefs known as 'ribbons' run parallel to the Continental Shelf. Adjacent to the Coral Sea trench, these ribbon reefs are recognized as the most pristine eco-systems in the reef's environment. Clear water provides the best possible underwater visibility, encourages rich coral growth and supports spectacular marine life. As the region's outer reef pioneer, we chose the best location available to show you nature's finest.

Day 14 – Monday March 9, 2026 - Cairns - Melbourne City Sights Tour

After breakfast we transfer to the Cairns Airport for our flight to Melbourne, Australia. Upon arrival in Melbourne, we enjoy a **City Sights Tour** including an English-speaking guide. See premier examples of Melbourne Victorian architectural splendor including St. Paul's Cathedral, Princess and Regent Theatres, Melbourne Town Hall, Parliament House, the Treasury Building, the Royal Exhibition buildings and the Queen Victoria Markets, as well as Fitzroy Gardens and Albert Park. The balance of the afternoon and evening is free to explore on our own. **(Breakfast)**

Overnight Stay: Melbourne – Clarion Suites Hotel

Day 15 – Tuesday - March 10, 2026 - Welcome to Fiji – Orientation

This morning, we transfer to the Melbourne airport and check through customs for our flight to Fiji. Upon arrival in Nadi, Fiji we have an orientation of the area and processing before arrival at our resort hotel for the next two nights. A luxury resort is situated in the heart of Fiji's Coral Coast. Outrigger Fiji Beach Resort is set on a white sand beach, amongst 40 acres of tall palms and lush tropical landscaped gardens. The resort was designed and built to reflect the true Fijian experience and way of life; it is where traditional Fijian village meets five-star luxury!

Enjoy all the amenities of the resort including beach access, restaurants, guest services and relaxing with sun-sand-beaches!!
